More Opportunity in 2020!

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) first relaxed the rules for supplemental benefits for the 2019 plan year, but limited the eligible services to options such as transportation and home healthcare. For 2020, CMS expanded that flexibility to allow for additional benefits such as meal services and air quality devices for asthma patients. Uptake for 2019 was slow, however—a recent study estimated that just 21% of MA beneficiaries were offered these benefits this year. Learn more here.
