- •February 12, 2021 @ 5:00 p.m. Deadline to Register in Your Municipal Clerk's Office-
- •February 16 from 7:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. Register to Vote at Your Polling Place-

Note: If requesting an absentee ballot, please don't wait until the deadline. Mailing ballots takes time, so make your request soon and complete and return your ballot quickly.

Award to Facilitate Network Collaboration from The Administration for Community Living!

In support of their *Strategic Framework for Action*, the Administration for Community Living (ACL), has invited GWAAR, the Wisconsin aging network, and the State of Wisconsin to participate in their Network Lead Entities (NLEs) Think Tank.

As noted in recently shared research, social determinants of health, such as social, behavioral, and environmental factors account for 60% of the factors influencing



sustainability of aging and disability networks to deliver high quality, coordinated services in an increasingly value-based, integrated care environment, such as forming community health integrated networks (CIHNs). ACL has awarded \$125,000 for the facilitation and further expansion of our established community-based organizations network in addressing social determinants of health for our communities.

Network partners are invited to join GWAAR as we engage with ACL, Advancing States, N4A, Mission Analytics Group, the Aging and Disability Business Institute and leading Aging and Disabilities Services providers in five other states.
