What Respite Can Look Like

A faith-based site provides respite care for individuals with special needs on-site, so that their family member can attend a service without having to leave.

You spend quality time with an older adult while their loved one goes shopping, has a doctor's appointment, or does something for themselves.

During the summer, one day a month you rent a park shelter so that parents can drop off their children with disabilities for a few hours.

You open a respite day program in your community. This is a safe place for adults with disabilities and memory impairments can go so that their caregivers can have a break.

You own a childcare business, and want to add a respite program to give parents of children with special needs a short break

You want to provide employment for in-home respite providers while taking care of the business side of your program.

What Is Respite?

Respite care, whether on a planned or emergency basis, is taking a short break from caregiving duties, and it allows the caregiver an opportunity to rest, refresh, and recharge. Respite care can occur in the provider or care recipient's home, community, or facility-based environment.

There is a Need for More Respite Programs in WI

In Wisconsin, there is funding available to pay for respite care. But in most communities throughout the state, there are very few, if any, providers.

Some respite programs use volunteers, and there is no fee. Other respite care is a paid service through waiver funds that are provided by the state.

Course Requirements

To successfully complete the workshop, you will:

- participate in all virtual face-to-face sessions (three),
- participate in discussion board and assignments,
- complete course project, and
- participate in short follow-up surveys 3-, 6-, and 12-month after the course concludes.

Course Project

The goal of this workshop is for you to have a start on a business plan or program design for a respite program. Each week, you will be given more information to build this plan. At the end of the course, you will give a short presentation (5-10 min) about your respite program plan and the next steps. You will receive feedback as you move forward with your program plan.

Successful Completion of the Workshop

Along with creating a respite program plan, RCAW wants to continue to support you in your respite program development. Upon completion of the workshop, you will receive:

- Access to the RCAW & Direct Course Partnership, giving you access to more than 45 online courses (over 500 hours of continuing education).

- An opportunity to receive up to \$4,000 for your business to provide respite care from an RCAW start-up business grant for underserved populations.
