# New State Legislature & New Congress

Last Tuesday (January 3, 2023) was Inauguration Day for the Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, and many members of Wisconsin's 106th State Legislature (including every state Assembly Representative, and half of the State Senators whose terms ran on even cycles).

Retirements, resignations, and redistricting lead to many of us having new state legislators. Getting to know your new legislators and beginning to build a relationship with them is an essential first step. To find out who your state legislators are for the 2023-2024 Legislative Session go to the
