Eat Smart, Move More, Weigh Less OAA Title IIID Funding

The Eat Smart, Move More, Weigh Less program meets the Administration for Community Living definition of "evidence-based program" designed to improve the health and well-being, and reduce disease and injury in older adults ages 60 and older and is therefore eligible for the use of Older Americans Act funds under Title IIID.



The turnkey program is led by Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (RDNs) hired and trained by NC State University. The role of the Health and Wellness Coordinator is to promote the program to older adults in their communities and provide data reporting to justify use of Title IIID funding.

At the 2023 NCOA Conference Angie Sullivan, OAA Consultant for GWAAR and Lisa Messer, Health Promotion Coordinator ADRC of Rock County, joined Kelly Nordby from NC State University to discuss how the program is currently being implemented across Wisconsin. This 40-minute webinar provides an overview of the program, describes how this online program can be a good fit for older adults in your community, discusses processes used to promote, recruit for, and implement the program at a local level.
