
#### What You Need to Get Started

Beneficiary's zip code List of Beneficiary's prescription drugs with dosage and quantity Pharmacy Beneficiary uses Medicare account information Other Helpful Information Medicare card • Other Health Insurance cards • Subsidy eligibility (Medicaid, Low Income Subsidy (LIS), State Pharmacy Assistance Program)

#### Plan Finder Steps

- 1. Enter anonymous information or Medicare Account information
  - 1. Zip Code
  - 2. Type of plan
- 2. Enter/review drugs by name, dose, and quantity
  - 1. No OTC medications
  - 2. No excluded or Part B drugs(if known)
- 3. Select pharmacies
  - 1. Choose up to 5
- 4. Review search results
  - 1. Don't forget to toggle between 2023 and 2024
  - 2. Plan Finder will default to 2024
- 5. Compare plans using default sort (total cost)
- 6. Review plan details

## Medicare Account Extra Help



#### IRA Changes now visible in Plan Finder

- \$35 or less for covered insulins
- \$0 catastrophic phase cost sharing
- \$0 out-of-pocket costs for ACIP-recommended vaccines
- Elimination of LIS partial subsidy status in favor of full subsidy benefits
  - In 2024, any beneficiaries who qualify for LIS subsidy will get full subsidy benefits
