

Advocacy Alert: Funding for Medicare Outreach at Risk

Advocates just learned that at the last minute, the fiscal year (FY) 2024 Continuing Resolution (CR) signed earlier this month to keep the federal government funded into early 2024, did not include the authorization and funding needed to continue the Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act's (MIPPA) low-income outreach and assistance program.

This major oversight currently leaves MIPPA unauthorized and unfunded. Without authorization, the Administration for Community Living (ACL) may find it complicated to administer the program in the next few months. Without continued funding, local State Health *Insurance* Assistance Programs (SHIPs), Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) and Aging Units/Aging and Disability Resource Centers (ADRCs) that rely on this funding to conduct targeted outreach to Medicare beneficiaries most in need of Medicare's cost-savings programs such as the Medicare Savings Programs and LIS/ExtraHelp, will also run into problems.

Wisconsin received \$713,193 in MIPPA funding for the current grant year which ends Aug. 31, 2024. This funding supports integral staff at ADRCs, aging units, the AAAs, the Board on Aging and Long Term Care (BOALTC), Disability Rights Wisconsin (DRW), Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council (GLITC), and the state Department of Health Services (DHS). If Congress does not renew MIPPA, we will experience a staffing crisis as agencies lose funding that has been reliably renewed for over a decade. We will also lose funding and staff capacity to provide dedicated outreach to historically marginalized populations, leaving our most vulnerable residents struggling to access free and unbiased Medicare counseling and financial assistance.

Your Advocacy is Needed: To prevent the discontinuation of MIPPA, our national partners are calling on us to reach out to U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin and Ron Johnson, as well as our U.S. Representative, to draw attention to this critical situation and push for reauthorization and funding of MIPPA in one of the early-2024 funding bills. **Your stories and data are critical to the continued success of this program!**

Call or email your federal legislators this week! Let them know how the MIPPA low-income outreach program brings value to the Medicare beneficiaries you serve.
