In its 2021 Report to Congress, the Supporting Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (SGRG) <u>Advisory Council</u> defined kin and/ or grandparent caregivers as **any grandparent or relative adults who have the primary responsibility for grandchildren or other children who cannot remain with their parents.**





An Underserved Population



- <u>Research</u> shows that kinship often leads to better outcomes for children.
- Generally, fewer placements.
- Greater stability.
- More contact with parents, siblings, and other kin.
- Generally, better mental and physical health, fewer behavior problems, higher levels of competence, higher levels of placement satisfaction, and better outcomes as adults.





An Underserved Population



- According to <u>Grandfamilies &</u> <u>Kinship Support Network</u> at least 2.4 million children are being raised in these families across the United States.
- Reauthorization 2020 removed the 10% max on grand/kinship families from the <u>National Family Caregiver</u> <u>Support Program</u> or NFCSP.

Caregiver Specialist

- Dane County AAA in 2023 served
 7 grandfamilies/older relative
 caregivers for 10% of grants
 awarded
- Connected with families through local organizations, Rainbow
 Project
- Referrals from Kinship Care Newsletter







What NFCSP can offer families?

- Summer camp, daycare, or other extracurricular programs
- Sports uniforms, equipment, fees
- Music, dance, art lessons
- Academic programs and tutoring





NFCSP Support for all Family Members

- Respite -Family/friend/primary CG can receive payment/stipend
- Home modifications to split a room for kids or expand space
- YMCA membership, local pool membership, or passes (can sign on extended family)

Sustaining Older Relative Caregivers of Children

- Therapeutic Yoga, meditation, massage, bodywork, exercise classes
- Transportation for children while they are at work
- Help with cleaning and chores at home



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- Kinship Care is available to families involved in the child welfare system (Child Protective Services, Youth Justice, & Guardianship) and those who are caring for their relatives informally (family arranged plan, voluntary guardianship).
- Eligible kinship care families receive \$375/mo. per child (2024)

Wisconsin Kinship Care Eligibility Requirements





- The basic needs of the child can be better met with the relative than with the parent.
 - The placement is in the best interests of the child.
- The child currently or might meet the requirements to need protection or services if the child were to remain with his or her parent(s) (abuse or neglect).



Kinship Navigator Grant

- Federal funding that supports relative caregivers. This funding supports a few projects/resources
- <u>Relative Caregiver Stakeholder</u> <u>Group (RCS)</u>
- Members offer recommendations, feedback, and guidance to DSP on the development of resources, supports, and education for relative caregivers in Wisconsin.









Kinship Navigator Grant

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1)County, tribes, and non-profits can apply for the <u>Relative</u> <u>Caregiver Supports</u> funding.

- Awarded agencies use the funds for Support Groups, Zoo / YMCA membership, "brief" legal services, and concrete supports.
- Families receiving support do NOT already need to be involved with county services.



Kinship Navigator Grant





2) **Families Like Mine** conference. This annual event is only open to relative caregivers and is planned with their input. Topics have included: Forgiveness, Trauma, The effects of in-utero drug use, court process, mental health of child and caregiver, and self-care. Connecting with other caregivers is also an important part of the day and is always prioritized.

- Wisconsin Kinship Navigator
- Resource for Relative Caregivers created with guidance from the RCS group (above).
- The purpose is to help caregivers with navigating the Child Welfare system and provide a customized 211-guided search for caregivers.
