#### Don't forget to vote!

The Fall Partisan Primary is today, August 13! Review what is on your ballot, where your polling place is, and check your registration status at <u>www.myvote.wi.gov</u>.



Late last month, **the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee passed S. 4776 - the Older Americans Act (OAA) Reauthorization Act of 2024.** This bill reauthorizes OAA titles beginning in FY 2026 through FY 2029 with a 4.62-percent increase each year.

This is only the first step in the process. A floor vote by the Senate is unlikely until there is agreement between the House and the Senate on a final bill. Watch for advocacy alerts in the coming weeks encouraging the House Committee to advance their reauthorization bill.

OAA reauthorization bills typically do not come to a floor vote until there is agreement between the House and the Senate on a final bill. So, our advocacy focus now shifts to the House. Watch for new advocacy alerts in the coming weeks!
