Recap from June's In-District Listening Session: Thank you to those who were able to attend the In-District listening session held on June 16, 2025 at ADRC of Brown County.

The session fostered open dialogue around the importance of advocacy and what elected leaders need to hear from their constituents when shaping policy and making critical budgetary decisions. Participants emphasized that the voices of aging adults, individuals with disabilities, and their caregivers are essential in guiding responsive and equitable public policy.

The listening session brought together a small, focused group of advocates to share firsthand experiences and concerns related to key issues including caregiver support, dementia care, disability services, Medicaid access, falls prevention, food security, home-delivered meals, transportation, transition planning, and parent education.

ADRC of Brown County plans to continue facilitating these listening sessions on a biennial basis, ensuring that the evolving needs of our aging and disability communities are communicated directly to decision-makers like you.
