The Wisconsin Senior Employment Program (WISE) Program provides unemployed adults aged 55 and older with training opportunities and part-time, paid work experience in community service organizations. The on-the-job experience helps build and improve WISE participants' skills for permanent employment.



Typical WISE placements include:

- Clerical/Office
- Library Aide
- Retail/Sales/Production
- Groundskeeping/Maintenance
- Food Service
- Custodial/Maintenance
- Customer Service

How Do I Qualify?

To qualify for the WISE Program, you must be:

- 55 years of age or older
- Unemployed and want to work
- On a limited income
- A resident of the county served

What Happens Once I Qualify?

The WISE Program coordinator works with each WISE Program participant to determine their areas of interest and skills and where they need to enhance skills. A work site placement is sought to meet the WISE participant's needs.

While in the WISE Program, the WISE Program coordinator will work with the WISE Program participant to establish a plan to enhance their job skills.
